NOTES TO THE SUMMARY FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the Year ended 30 September 2024

- The reporting entity is Pub Charity Limited (the "Company"). The Company is domiciled in New Zealand and was incorporated in New Zealand on 14 September 2012 under the Companies Act 1993.
- 2. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in New Zealand ("NZ GAAP"). They comply with Public Benefit Entity International Public Sector Accounting Standards ("PBE IPSAS") and other applicable financial reporting standards as appropriate that have been authorised for use by the External Reporting Board for Not-For-Profit entities. For the purposes of complying with NZ GAAP, the Company is a public benefit not-for-profit entity and is applying Tier 1 Not-For-Profit PBE IPSAS as it has expenditure of more than \$33 million.
- 3. The summary financial statements have been extracted from the full financial statements. The financial statements of Pub Charity Limited including, Statement of Service Performance, Statement of Comprehensive Revenue and Expense, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Changes in Net Assets and a Cash Flow Statement. The summary financial statements do not include all the disclosures contained in the full financial statements and cannot be expected to provide as complete an understanding as provided by the full financial statements.

- 4. Pub Charity Limited remains compliant with R11A as at 30 September 2024 with a Working Capital Ratio Reserve of 1.33.
- 5. There were no capital commitments or contingent assets or liabilities at the reporting date.
- 6. The annual full financial statements of Pub Charity Limited have been audited by Grant Thornton New Zealand Audit Limited, who have issued an unqualified audit opinion.
- 7. The Directors authorised the publication of these Summary Financial Statements on 22 November 2024.
- There are no events subsequent to the reporting date that require disclosure.
